Opioid Stewardship Program Quickinar Series

This Opioid Stewardship Program Quickinar Series, created by HSAG, provides an action-based approach of tactics, strategies, and information needed to implement a successful Opioid Stewardship Program. Each quickinar in the series builds upon the previous session with many nationally recognized subject matter experts lending their expertise to the sessions. Attendees include staff from acute care inpatient departments, emergency departments, and post-acute care and are provided guidance on completing a gap assessment, identifying and implementing best practices, tracking progress, and accessing tools and resources. Four Kentucky Clinics Certified to Provide Integrated Primary and Behavioral Health Care Services

Kentucky selected among just 10 states to take part in Medicaid demonstration project aimed at caring for Kentuckians battling substance use or mental health disorders

Kentucky has certified four community mental health clinics to participate in a program designed to expand access to behavioral health care and medical services for any Kentuckian in need. The development is a significant step forward in efforts to expand behavioral services into Kentucky communities, ensuring greater accessibility for behavioral health services such as treatment for substance use and mental health disorders.

The newly certified clinics are part of a broader national program to demonstrate the effectiveness of a health care model for service delivery and payment. Kentucky was selected along with nine other states to operate a limited number of Certified Behavioral Health Clinics (CCBHCs) in an effort to expand access to mental health, substance use, and primary health

care services. As part of the demonstration, providers will receive an enhanced federal funding match for the treatment of Medicaid patients to incentivize utilization of the CCBHC program.

Governor Andy Beshear described the model as "a significant advancement in the delivery of behavioral health care in Kentucky." He continued, "We have made tremendous progress in this state, but too often someone seeking care for issues such as depression, anxiety, and addiction are left to navigate complicated, frequently disjointed systems. These clinics bring behavioral and physical health services under one roof and tailor services to the needs of the individual. This gives us the ability to treat the whole person, prevent further complications, and improve health outcomes."

CCBHCs must provide care regardless of an individual's ability to pay, serving those who are on Medicaid, underserved, homeless, have low incomes, or are uninsured. Care is also ensured for those who are active-duty military or veterans.

The clinics, based in the Lexington, Louisville, Northern Kentucky, and Northeast Kentucky areas, are open and currently providing services to clients in 42 counties. For more information, individuals may contact agencies by phone or through their individual websites;

Drug Czar Talks Drug Crisis during Kentucky Visit

State and federal leaders say they're working to address the growing addiction crisis in Kentucky and the U.S.

Dr. Rahul Gupta, director of the U.S. Office of National Drug Control Policy under President Joe Biden, met with Republican U.S. Senator Mitch McConnell, state Republican Senate President Robert Stivers and others in Louisville Thursday to discuss the issue.

Gupta said the current crisis is being fueled by the highly powerful synthetic opioid fentanyl. A person dies every five minutes on average from substance use, he said.
